## ***A New Movement of the Holy Spirit in the Conference***

The evidence of a special work of the Holy Spirit was seen at the 2002 Annual Meeting in Lansing, Michigan. Two of the churches that were received into membership, the Brazilian Cong. Church of Houston, Texas and the North Country Bible Fellowship of Speculator, New York, are recent church plants. After years of prayer preparation, God is blessing the efforts of church multiplication of the CCCC.

A Church Multiplication Committee was formed in 2000 for the purpose of leading the Conference efforts in church planting. The members of the Task Force attended training led by the Church Multiplication Training Center. Since that time, the Conference has cooperated with the CMTC by recommending their "Church Planter's Boot Camp" as a training center for church planters. Over ten Conference pastors have attended this training in the past two years. The Committee has developed a church multiplication mission statement to direct its work: "To birth and develop healthy reproducing churches by resourcing CCCC churches and pastors."

As a direct result of the training received, the Forestdale Community Church, pastored by Paul McPheeters, in Malden, Massachusetts, has started a daughter church in its community. The daughter church, the Community Church of Edgeworth, was started in 2001 under the leadership of Matthew Kruse. The church has developed a solid core group of young members and is holding regular worship services in a local school. The unusual but exciting aspect of this church plant is that the Forestdale Church has less than 120 members. Their faith and vision to prioritize church

multiplication serve as an example to the entire Conference.

The Upper Midwest Congregational Fellowship (UMCF) has launched a new church planting project in 2002. Having already planted churches in Woodbury, Minnesota, and Avon, Minnesota, the Fellowship called Rev. Dan Schauer and his wife, Marsha, to serve as church planters to begin a new work in Inver Grove Heights, Minnesota. This area, located south of St. Paul, is experiencing growth and is an ideal site for a new CCCC church.


The Schauers will attend the CMTC Boot Camp training in Dallas, Texas in October. They will then build a core group of members for the church with the goal of beginning church services in the Fall of 2003.

Pastor Ron Hamilton of the Woodbury Community Church will serve as a coach for this project.

The UMCF is also working with Rev. Malcolm Collins to start a church planting ministry to a growing community of Somali immigrants in the Minneapolis-St. Paul area.

CCCC member churches and pastors are encouraged to prayerfully support the work of church multiplication. A

Church Multiplication Fund has been established in the Conference to assist

## Carlton's Comments



October 1st will be the second "birthday" of the position of Northeast Regional Minister. So far this calendar year I have thoroughly enjoyed visiting thirty-two of our churches and meeting so many of the wonderful people who are a part of the Conference.

From all reports the position of Regional Minister has met an important need in the ministry that the Lord has given the CCCC in Eastern New York, New Jersey and New England.

But now, at the two year mark, we have come to a critical juncture. At present the support level stands at \$2,213.89 a month which is \$2,000 a month below what we need to continue this position.

If that amount of support is not generated by December 31, we will have to terminate the position.

After serving for two years and seeing the response, I cannot imagine that it is God's desire to cease having a Regional Minister for the Northeast.

The need is for regular, monthly giving, rather than periodic, one time gifts. I am deeply thankful that for the past two years many of you have been sacrificial in your financial commitment. Certainly that has been very helpful.

We need additional churches and individuals to join the monthly support team.

As our Conference Minister has indicated, if we had 4 new giving units at \$100 a month, 8 new giving units of \$50.00 a month, 30 new giving units of

\$25.00 a month plus 45 new giving units of \$10.00 a month, we would have the amount that we need to move forward. Some of our smallest churches have already set an excellent example for all of us.

If you yourself, the church that you attend, or someone you know personally could begin giving or increase what is already being given for the Regional Minister position, we would be able to continue this important ministry in the years to come.

Will you join me in praying for God's provision and will you pray about how you might be a part of His answer?

## Short-Term Missions Trips to Bulgaria Change Lives and Challenge Team Members

Two CCCC churches, Woodbury Community Church (MN) and Darlington Congregational Church, (IN) took a significant step in August in developing their “sister church” relationships with churches in Bulgaria by taking teams of people to Bulgaria. Each church had specific purposes and goals in mind for their short-term missions trips.

The Woodbury Community Church’s purpose was to learn about Bulgaria, to become acquainted with the needs of the evangelical Congregational churches in Bulgaria, to visit their sister church in Banya, and to share in various ministry opportunities.

The Darlington Congregational Church had as its goals to help restore the historic relationship between Congregational churches in the United States and Bulgaria, to encourage their brothers and sisters in Christ, and to support and grow the evangelical efforts and spread of the Gospel in Bulgaria.

The eight days the Darlington team spent in and around Stara Zagora were very busy and focused on achieving their goals. They participated in two Sunday services, held men’s and women’s discussion groups on how to bring the Gospel to the community, had a youth night, and made visits to churches in nearby villages.

The Darlington team returned with newfound respect for the heroic witness by Christian evangelicals in Bulgaria after so many years of oppression. Darlington team member, Laura Randle,

told of a “truly amazing moment in our Bulgarian experience ... we sang together the old Congregational hymns in both languages ... it brought tears to my eyes to know that two very different cultures could come together ... to sing the same hymns that glorify and honor God. What an awesome God we have!”

Amanda Boyanowski, the youngest team member, says about her experience, “... From the lessons learned there, I feel more fit to minister to those around me, and to serve people in a new way.”

The short-term missions trip to Bulgaria was truly life-changing for the Darlington team and according to David Boyanowski, team leader, “Our Bulgarian experience gave us a deep appreciation for the working of God in the hearts and lives of believers worldwide.”

The Woodbury Community Church team spent the first five days of their trip in Sofia visiting a day kindergarten and an orphanage, leaving gifts of toys and money. They also participated in worship services at two churches in the area, the highlight of which was when they sang together “Amazing Grace” in both languages. They spent the last five days of the trip with the people of Banya where they led seminars and worshipped with their Bulgarian brothers and sisters in Christ. There was an emotional farewell as they left Banya to return to Sofia and the long trip home.

Like the Darlington Congregational Church team, the Woodbury Community Church team has been deeply impacted as a result of their trip. Ken Mosner, a team member, commented, “When I left for the trip, I felt that I had very little to offer the people in Bulgaria. The trip made me realize that I was sent by the Lord to receive the blessings by experiencing the unconditional love the Bulgarian believers have for God and his people.”

Another team member, Darlene Wendlandt added, “I was impressed by the openness and hospitality of people in Bulgaria. Pastor Blagovest Nikolov from Banya worked very hard to plan our visit. We were received with warmth and love on every stop of our trip and were encouraged by the commitment of these people.”

## Obituaries

### Rev. Arthur W. Childs

Rev. Arthur W. Childs died June 12, 2002 in Lebanon, New Hampshire after a brief illness.

Rev. Childs was born in Deerfield, Massachusetts on August 14, 1912.





